The Mary, Mary Month of MAY

As Catholics, May is traditionally a month where we give special devotion to the Virgin Mary. Have you ever wondered why? October is already devoted to the Rosary and there are other days of the year when we honor Mary such as the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God (January 1st), the Solemnity of the Assumption (August 15th) and the Solmenity of the Immaculate Conception (Dec 8th).



The practice of paying extra special attention to Mary in May started about 700 years ago. May begins the season of new life and growth. As the earth (and we) emerge from the long winter, it makes sense to honor Mary, whose "yes" to God brought the new life of Jesus Christ to the world.

There are many ways to celebrate this special month of Mary:

- **Daily Rosary:** Dedicate 15 or 20 minutes a day to praying the Rosary throughout May. Who knows? Maybe it will become a habit that lasts all year long.
- **May Crowning:** We will be crowning the statue of Mary in the Chapel and in the Mary Garden as part of our 1st Saturday and school celebrations. If you have a statue of Mary at home consider buying or making a wreath of flowers to place on her head.
- **Learn a new Marian prayer this month.** All of us know the "Hail Mary" and most of know the "Hail, Holy Queen", but how about learning the "Memorare", "Magnificat" or the "Angelus"?


We are so fortunate to have a great intercessor as Mary, the Mother of God, the Ever-Virgin, and the Immaculate Conception. Make it a point to do something extra-special this month to strengthen your own Marian devotion.

I'm Awesome?

Some friends of mine recently attended the funeral of their 17-year old nephew who was killed in a car accident. At the end of the funeral, the song "I'm Awesome" was played. (I found the tune on YouTube-If you want to listen to it, get the "clean" version.) This is a rap song where the singer seems to be trying to convince himself that he is not only OK, but awesome. The other voice in the song keeps telling him about all of his downfalls, problems, shortcomings and flaws. Although I'm not much of a rap music fan, this song can give us some insights into the inner life of many teens and young adults. They want very much to be seen by others as viable and significant, but for some reason they don't even see themselves that way.

I have noticed the negative results of this type of self image in many of the kids I visit at the Juvenile Detention Center. I am out there every Monday evening and usually visit four or five of the kids who are residing there. Many of them come from family backgrounds that are anything but typical. Several have been rejected by their dad and mom and live with another relative or are in foster care. Their family situation, and the attitude of life they develop leads them to all sorts of antisocial and self-destructive behaviors. They seem to say with their actions: "Since I'm not worth much, it doesn't matter what I do or who I do it to." Their desire is to be "awesome" in someone's eyes and to be loved for who they are.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us a command that should make us sit up and pay attention. He says, "Love one another, as I have loved you." This is no easy task. Jesus is telling you and me that we have to love others the same way Jesus loves them. In other words, we're supposed think others are as awesome as Jesus does. This means we have to love everyone else, even people we don't like very well, to the extent that we would die for them. In truth, we may not be called on to die a physical death for someone else, but we must be willing to serve them in a sacrificial way. What a high calling-to love as God loves! Jesus also says that others will know we are Christians simply because we love each other. So many people in the world are starved for true love: people in our own family, our own neighborhood, our own parish and our own workplace. We need to heed the words of our Savior and show them that they are lovable. Despite all of our own downfalls, problems, shortcomings and flaws, Jesus loved us first and thinks we're awesome.
