BROOM TREE SILENT RETREAT

I will be leading a silent retreat for women at Broom Tree Retreat Center from Thursday evening, Nov. 3rd through 5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 6th. If you have never been on a silent retreat, I highly recommend you consider trying it. All of us need to carve out time in our lives to slow down and listen to God speak to us. God often speaks the best in silence. If you have never been to Broom Tree, it is a wonderful place out in the country near Irene, SD. All you need to bring is a Bible, a journal and yourself. The cost for the retreat is based on your ability to pay.

The daily schedule contains four or five general conferences, each approximately a half hour in length. Each conference is followed by a free period in which to reflect and pray on the scripture presented and to apply it to one's own life. There is also an opportunity for Spiritual Direction. Each day the everyone has the opportunity to participate in the Eucharist, the Rosary, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Benediction. Being silent, waiting, and listening for God to speak, with nowhere to go, no agenda to keep, and no superficial social contacts are key ingredients for communicating with God. The beauty of the grounds also helps dispose oneself to hearing the Lord speak. Remember: Elijah did not find God in the earthquake, hurricane, or fire, but in the quiet breeze. (1 Kings 19:12). TURKEY BINGO IS COMING BACK!

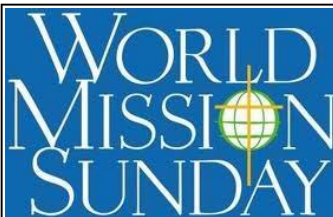
